

## VENUE VISUAL GUIDE

## NATIONAL THEATRE OF SCOTLAND

I am going to see a show at Dunoon Burgh Hall, Argyll Street, Dunoon, PA23 7DD.



This is the Dunoon Burgh Hall, where the performance is taking place.

Dunoon Burgh Hall is located on Argyll Street, the main street through the town.



This is the Main Entrance. I will enter through the green door.



If I am a wheelchair user or have mobility issues, there is a ramp I can use on the right hand side of the stairs.



When I walk inside, I will see this area called the Foyer. It might be quite busy and noisy with other members of the audience.

My ticket will be checked by a friendly volunteer. I can ask them questions about the event.



There is a Cafe where I can buy drinks and snacks.

I can sit inside or outside in the garden and relax before the show.

If I would like to take some time out during the play, I may leave at any time and find a seat here.



This is the Shop where I can buy souvenirs and sit down before the show.

It is located at the left of the Foyer.



The performance will take place in the hall upstairs.

I can use the main stairs in the Foyer or take the lift. If I want to use the lift, I will find it in the far right corner of the Shop.

I can ask staff for directions at any point.



There are accessible and gender-neutral toilets on both floors of the venue.

I can find them by following signs or I can ask a member of staff for directions.



**Auditorium/ Performance space:** I will watch Dear Billy in this room, but the seating might be set up differently.

The lights will dim when the show is ready to start, and the actors will come on to the stage. They may interract with the audience.

If I am disturbed by any noises or lights, I can ask staff for earplugs, ear defenders and dark glasses. I will have to return them after the play finishes.



At the end of the show the audience will clap to show the actors that they enjoyed the show.

When the clapping has ended, the lights will get brighter. This means the show is over.

I can now leave the theatre.

I should exit back through the way I came in.
