

VENUE VISUAL GUIDE



I am going to see a show at the Royal Lyceum Theatre, 30b Grindlay Street, Edinburgh, EH3 9AX.



This is the Royal Lyceum Theatre, where the performance is taking place.

If I have my e-ticket, I should have it ready to be scanned at the main door. If I don't have an e-ticket, I can go to the box office to buy or pick up my ticket.



When I enter the theatre I will be inside a big room called the Foyer.

There will be digital screens on the walls showing various images on rotation and the space may be quite busy with lots of other people around.



This is the Box Office. This is where I can buy tickets or collect prepaid tickets for the show.



I will go up these stairs to reach the auditorium. If I go through the white doors I will reach the Howard Bar, where the toilets are located.

I will need to have my ticket ready to show to the ushers who will be at the door before I go in. They will help me find my seat.

The ushers may also be handing out freesheets and can help me if I have any questions.



There is a lift on the ground floor that I can use to get up to the auditorium entrance.

To get to it, on arrival to the foyer I should follow the floor round to the far left and past the shop.

The lift and an accessible toilet will be in the corridor in front of me.



Auditorium/ Performance space:

I will watch the performance in this large room. My seat number is on my ticket. It will have a letter for the seating row and a seat number. An usher can help me find it.

There will be lots of other audience members in the auditorium, it may be busy and quite noisy before the show begins.



The lights will dim when the show is ready to start and the actors will come on the stage.

The actors won't be able to talk directly to me during the play. They will be in character.

The audience should be quiet while the lights are dimmed and the actors are on stage.



At the end of the show the audience will clap to show the actors that they enjoyed the show.

When the clapping has ended, the lights will get brighter. This means the show is over.

I can now leave the theatre and should exit through the foyer.



Toilets are available on all levels. If I need to go to the toilet, I should look for these toilet signs or ask a member of staff for directions.
